### What is it?

#### A MGRP IS

- Creative <u>and</u> research based
- Begun with an interest
- Emotional and logical
- From multiple perspectives
- Composed of text, art, visuals, and more
- Much more fun

#### A MGRP IS NOT

- A single piece of writing
- Begun with a thesis
- Distant from audience
- From a single perspective
- Only composed of text
- Boring

### In short...

- You will read and study the story you choose in class.
  - This project should require little to no homework.
- You choose the story, but it cannot be one we've studied in class (no poems).
- You will complete 8 smaller assignments to take the place of a written book report or essay.

### The Rules

- You will read, study, and research in class each day – your grade for the first part of this assignment will depend on it.
- The story has to be long and challenging enough.
- Each genre MUST prove research on the author or that you read the story 2 pieces over the author and 3 over story/characters + 3 mandatory = 8.
- Creativity and attention to detail WILL COUNT.

### Guidelines

- You'll turn in 8 small assignments
- 3 specific assignments are mandatory
  - Teaching
  - Cartoon
  - Works Cited
- You'll choose the other 5 from a list
- There are 3 categories:
  - Written
  - Art
  - Other

### Guidelines cont'd

- You'll organize your final as follows:
  - 3 mandatory genres
  - 2 from the "Written" category
  - 2 from the "Art" category
  - 1 from either "Other" category

# Mandatory Pieces

- 1. Presentation/Teaching
  - Prove mastery of story's <u>Literary</u>
     <u>Theme</u>, <u>Setting</u>, <u>Climax</u>, & <u>Summary</u>
- 2. Cartoon
  - Prove mastery of story's <u>Climax</u>
- 3. Works Cited
  - Prove mastery of a website... smh

# Public Speaking Piece

- Each story from the book has its own "Literary Term" that you'll find in the preface.
- You will explain and provide examples of this term to the class, "teaching it" to your classmates.
- You will also summarize the story you chose, including setting and climax.
- Your presentation can last no less than 3 minutes and no more than 5 minutes.

#### Cartoon

Create a <u>cartoon that depicts the climax</u> of the story you've read. The cartoon must be a minimum of <u>3</u> <u>frames</u>. Words within the frames must help the reader infer the meaning of the event being depicted; however, words should be kept to a minimum. The frames must be written/drawn in sequential order.

- Include the following:
  - 1. A creative title
  - 2. Words AND pictures
    - Can be handwritten/drawn or computergenerated

### Works Cited

- Work<u>S</u> Cited, not Work Cited...
- Must include citations for no less than 3 resources.
  - One will be your Literature Book

# Title Page Scoring

Should look precisely as instructed & be on the front of packet you turn in.

# FQI Scoring

- At least 15 lines full with
  - Fact from the story
  - Answered or Unanswered question pertaining to the fact
  - Interpretation, i.e., how you could represent the answer in a genre

### **Genre Scoring**

- All 7 present
- Professional, unique, thorough, and impressive
- Each one proves comprehension mastery of the story or author
- 2 author + 3 story + 3 mandatory
- Will be pages 3-9 of turned in packet

# Works Cited Scoring

- At least 3 resources cited
- Alphabetical order
- Proper MLA formatting
- Will be page 10 of the packet you turn in
- Titled Works Cited

### Presentation Scoring

- At least 3 minutes, no more than 5 minutes long
- Proves mastery of comprehension of the story in summarization
  - Should include full summary of story plus setting, climax, and main characters (analysis)
- Proves understanding of story's Literary Term through teaching it to the class – definition, example from story, and example classmates can relate to (contemporary)
